Programmes Description

Language Skills for Academic Success and Intercultural Competence

- Develops advanced language skills for academic reading, writing, listening, and speaking.

- Integrates practical tasks to build accuracy, fluency, and confidence in academic contexts.
- Encourages reflection on cultural perspectives and their impact on language use and learning.
- Provides tools for fostering intercultural understanding and collaboration in multilingual settings.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the programme, participants will be able to:

1. Demonstrate improved academic language proficiency, using appropriate vocabulary, register, and structure in both spoken and written contexts.
2. Apply effective communication strategies for academic interaction, including active listening, note-taking, summarising, and presenting.
3. Produce coherent and well-structured academic texts suitable for various academic purposes.
4. Exhibit heightened intercultural awareness and sensitivity in diverse educational and professional environments.
5. Adapt language and communication style to different cultural and academic contexts.
6. Reflect critically on their own intercultural experiences to enhance collaboration and mutual understanding in global learning settings.

Creative English Teaching and Digital Literacy

- Explores innovative and creative approaches to teaching English across different learner levels.
- Introduces a range of digital tools and online platforms to enhance language learning and student engagement.
- Demonstrates how technology can support creativity, communication, and collaboration in English language classrooms.
- Provides hands-on practice with digital resources for lesson design, materials creation, and assessment.
- Encourages creative use of multimedia and interactive tasks to develop learners' language skills.
- Promotes digital literacy and critical awareness in both teachers and students.

- Encourages reflective practice on personal cultural awareness and communication approaches.
- Integrates collaborative learning methodologies, including project-based and cooperative learning techniques.
- Highlights the role of empathy, respect, and global citizenship in effective educational collaboration.

- Highlights collaborative approaches involving teachers, support staff, families, and the wider educational community.
- Encourages reflection on personal teaching practice to foster a more inclusive and supportive learning environment.

Preventing Peer Bullying and Promoting Emotional Well-being

- Explores the causes, dynamics, and impact of peer bullying in school environments.
- Introduces strategies for promoting emotional well-being and resilience among learners.
- Provides practical intervention techniques and preventative measures to address bullying incidents.
- Examines positive classroom management approaches that foster safety, inclusion, and respect.
- Highlights the role of teachers, peers, and families in creating supportive learning communities.

- Encourages reflective practice and the development of personal skills for promoting empathy and conflict resolution.
- Integrates case studies, role-playing, and interactive workshops for hands-on learning and skill development.

Learning Outcomes

By the end of the programme, participants will be able to:

1. Recognise the signs and effects of peer bullying and understand its impact on learners' well-being and academic success.
2. Apply strategies to prevent and respond to bullying incidents in classroom and school settings.
3. Foster a positive, safe, and emotionally supportive learning environment for all students.
4. Promote learners' emotional resilience, empathy, and social skills through targeted activities and interventions.
5. Engage effectively with colleagues, parents, and the wider school community to support anti-bullying initiatives.
6. Reflect critically on personal teaching practices to enhance emotional support and inclusion for students.
7. Integrate evidence-based approaches for well-being and peer support into everyday classroom routines.

Conflict Resolution and Building Positive Relationships

- Theories and principles of conflict resolution in educational and social settings.
- EU policies and frameworks promoting social inclusion, respect, and peaceful communication.
- Types and causes of conflict among students, teachers, and within school communities.
- Communication skills and mediation techniques for managing and resolving conflicts constructively.
- Social and emotional learning (SEL) approaches to foster empathy, cooperation, and positive interactions.
- Restorative practices for repairing relationships and rebuilding trust within school communities.
- Reflective and collaborative strategies for sustaining harmonious and respectful learning environments.

By the end of the programme, participants will be able to:

1. Gain a solid understanding of conflict dynamics and their impact on learning and relationships.
2. Recognise how EU policies and educational frameworks support conflict prevention and social harmony.
3. Identify sources and patterns of conflict in educational settings and respond proactively.
4. Apply effective communication, negotiation, and mediation skills to resolve conflicts constructively.
5. Foster empathy, emotional intelligence, and positive relationships among students and staff.
6. Implement restorative approaches to build trust and accountability within school communities.
7. Reflect on personal communication styles and enhance professional practice to promote peaceful, inclusive environments.
